## Daniel Wolfgang Pfeiffer

His passion for Jazz, he developed in the earliest youth through the music of Miles Davis, Passport, Volker Kriegel, Weatherreport, The Manavishnu Orchestra, Shakti, Stanly Clark and many other, because here, in addition to the influence of the music of various musical cultures, a symbiosis of rock and jazz took place.

Daniel Wolfgang Pfeiffer, born in 1955 in Dülken, got his first guitar with 6 years. He began his career as a 15 year old bassist a rock band and played in different rock-, new-wave- and pop bands, toured through Great Britain, France, Italy, Netherlands and Germany, before he is active in the Jazz music thinking.

His music sounds like a transformation of these influences to a possible, contemporary development of Jazz-Fusion, where the influence of the World-Music resp. Ethno-Jazz also visible.

Some of his compositions counterpoint European music recall the compositions techniques of classical music and jazz to enrich the other elements. A previously unheard music with taking a on a journey and touched by their meditative character.
