## **Leigh Stephens**

**Leigh Stephens** is an American <u>guitarist</u> and <u>songwriter</u> best known for being former lead guitarist of the <u>San Francisco</u> <u>psychedelic rock</u> group <u>Blue Cheer</u>.

## **Blue Cheer**

Stephens has recorded two albums with the band, <u>Vincebus Eruptum</u> and <u>Outsideinside</u>. He has claimed to have been the only member of the band who did not use drugs. His replacement as Blue Cheer's lead guitarist was <u>Randy Holden</u>.

## **After Blue Cheer**

Stephens went on to form Silver Metre in 1969, with <u>Pete Sears, Micky Waller</u> (drummer), and Jack Reynolds (singer), recorded one album at <u>Trident Studios</u> in London, England, released on the <u>National General Records</u>, produced by their manager, FM rock radio pioneer <u>Tom Donahue</u>.

His 1971 album, *And a Cast of Thousands* featured among other musicians, his fellow bandmembers from the above-mentioned band, together with the power trio <u>Ashton, Gardner & Dyke</u>, together with the two sax players from <u>If</u>, <u>Dave Quincey</u>, <u>Dick Morrissey</u>, and <u>Jethro Tull</u> bassist, <u>Glenn Cornick</u>.

## Recognition

He was ranked number 98 on <u>Rolling Stone</u> magazine's list of the 100 greatest guitarists of all time.
